Impact Investments in Adult Self Sufficiency will:

- fund work along the entire continuum from basic needs to work force development and asset building

Organizations represent large established service providers as well as innovative small, community based organizations.

Impact Outcomes:

- 40% of the funded organizations will help over 70,000 people maintain stability through basic needs including:
 - Food
 - Case Management
 - Shelter
 - Legal services
- Increased focus upon keeping senior citizens independent, working, and in their homes;
- Funding will address programs that expand and develop opportunities for low-income individuals to achieve upward economic mobility, including:
 - Educational opportunities
 - Career development opportunities that result in increased income, responsibilities, professional skills
 - Programs that provide access to asset building for education, home ownership, or micro-business
